What are they?

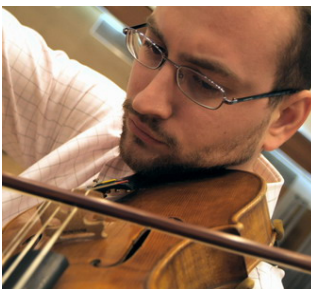
This is not just another string quartet: None of them are young, dyed blonde, or particularly slim, and they *never* pout at their audiences, nor (you will be happy to hear) do they wear revealing garments. However, most importantly, *they all play the viola!*
Viola quartets are considerably rarer animals.

Absolute Zero Viola Quartet have been playing as a group since 1995, and in that time have amassed an impressive library of viola quartet repertoire, embracing a wide and eclectic range of genre, guaranteed to delight any audience, be they first-timers or seasoned veteran concert attendees.

Who are they?



Peter Taylor, AGSM, trained at the Guildhall School of Music, was once a member of the BBC Symphony Orchestra (somewhere in England) before joining the BBC National Orchestra of Wales. His knowledge of viola repertoire is as astonishing as it is annoying. He used to live in a swamp in the Welsh valleys, and would arrive for rehearsals with mud up to his knees.



Dominic Jewel, B Mus (Hons), trained at the Royal College of Music, is always late for rehearsals, and habitually forgets to attend planning meetings in which the group decides democratically upon repertoire and who gets to play which part. Hence, he has to make do with what he is given by the rest of the group. This is how all quartets should function.



Ania Leadbeater, LRAM, trained at the Royal Academy of Music, was once a member of the Hallé Orchestra, but then escaped to South Wales. As well as being a fine player, she makes an extremely nice cup of coffee. Traditionally, no viola quartet rehearsal can start without a cup, and also a chocolate chip cookie, and a chat, and then another cup – then we may rehearse – or maybe not.



Ross Cohen, ARCM, trained at the Royal College of Music, winner of the Cobbett Prize for chamber music composition, used to be in a professional string quartet, and then joined the Hallé Orchestra, eventually defecting to BBC Wales in the early eighties. He thinks conductors and flat-packs are probably the work of the Satan.
